Tributes for Zach de Beer

PRESIDENT Nelson Mandela paid tribute yesterday to veteran politician Zach de Beer, who died of a stroke earlier in the day at his city home.

"On behalf of the government and himself, the president would like to convey condolences to the family," presidential spokesperson Parks Mankahlana said.

"The nation is the poorer for the loss of one who proved himself a principled opponent of apartheid, and then, as our ambassador, helped democratic South Africa establish itself as a member of the community of free nations," the statement said.

Democratic Party leader Tony Leon also paid tribute to De Beer, saying he had been an honourable man and an excellent leader.

Leon said it was very sad that De Beer would not be around to see the DP perform well in next week's general election, as he had been one of the party's founder leaders.

The New National Party said De Beer's death was deeply regretted and the party leadership conveyed its sincere condolences to his wife, family and friends.

"De Beer was a highly respected parliamentarian — a true gentleman politician.

"He was also regarded as a person who was fully committed to the ideals and principles of true liberalism," the NNP said in a statement. —Sapa
